



Fulufjällsbyn – Summer Activities

Swimming!

The many lakes dotting PAN Park Fulufjället are perfect for swimming, angling or canoeing.

By canoe or kayak

Would you like to enjoy the wilderness from the water? By boat, Canadian canoe or kayak, you move silently over the water hardly disturbing the beautiful environment and it gives you a better opportunity to watch the indigenous animals on the shore. You can make it just as exciting as you like; from canoe trips of more than one day to the challenge of canoeing the River Fulan or quietly paddling on the mirror-like lakes. PAN Village Fulufjällsbyn hires out boats, canoes and kayaks at one of the lakes.

(fly)Fishing

The lakes around Fulufjällsbyn are perfect for fly fishing. The manager of the holiday park can tell you where the best casts are and will provide you with a map of the various locations. There are some restrictions in PAN Park Fulufjället, but outside the park there are plenty of possibilities for salmon and trout fishing – e.g. on the Tröllsjön lakes. Fishing tackle can be hired and a fishing permit can also be obtained at the reception desk of PAN Village Fulufjällsbyn. Midsummer is the best time for angling.

Mountain biking

Mountain bikes can also be hired and you can do fantastic cycle tours through the PAN Park. The most unusual trails are mapped out, of course, and available at the reception desk.

Hiking

If you prefer walking and exploring PAN Park Fulufjället on your own, you can use the beautiful hiking trails that web the park. The valley in the nature reserve affords magnificent views and leads to Njupesjär, the waterfall with a drop of 93 metres and Sweden's most visited waterfall. Fjäll waterfall is also highly recommended and is only a 15-minute walk from Fulufjällsbyn.

There are trails of various distances and various degrees of difficulty. Maps of these trails are available at the reception desk. There are also special trails for children, please inquire at the reception.

Njupesjär trail: 4 kilometres

Rösjö trail: 15 kilometres

Tangsjö trail: 22.5 kilometres

Round the waterfall: 5.5 kilometres

Göljan trail: 17.5 kilometres

Post trail : 12 kilometres

Stenvallen trail: 6 kilometres

Visit a husky farm

Learn about the tough training these dogs have to go through, how a pack is formed and admire the stamina of these powerful animals.

Visistor centre 'Naturum'

Do not forget to drop in at 'Naturum' visitors' centre in PAN Park Fulufjället. There you can see how nature changes with each season, what animals can be found in the park and you can even hear birdsong from quite nearby. The visitors' centre is also the starting point for many guided tours.

Summer farm

Five kilometres east of the Njupeskar waterfall is Stenvallen, a typical and authentic summer farm. A guided tour of the authentic, historical buildings takes you 100 years back in time and introduces you to the traditional lifestyle of people living in the country at that time.

Golf!

Forty-five minutes by car takes you to Idre and Sweden's most beautiful golf course. Going from hole to hole you simply cannot but enjoy the beauty of the mountains, forests and lakes that surround you. If you stay in PAN Village Fulufjällsbyn, you will receive 20% discount on the green fee of Idrefjällens Golfklubb.

Hiking

Starting at PAN Village Fulufjällsbyn and aided by a guide, you set off for an adventurous 6-hour hike on the mountain plateau. Or go on a (half-) day-long exploratory expedition with a guide who can tell you everything about the flora and fauna of PAN Park Fulufjället.

Horseback riding

In case you are a bit tired of walking, you can also explore the wilderness on horseback. You need not be an experienced rider for this 2-hour ride through the park; the guide will adjust the tour to your riding skills.

Fly fishing

Have you always wanted to go fly fishing? With a course of about two hours (on Saturday or Sunday, SEK 450.-) given by a seasoned angler, you will soon get the hang of it. Once you have mastered it, you can sign up for an organized fly-fishing day on the river Fulan where you will get advice on what fly to use for the kind of fish you are after. You start early in the morning; on this day will also learn to recognize the best casts (SEK 1200.-). There is also the possibility of going on an organized fishing trip to the Tröllsjön lakes. We also arrange special fishing excursions for children. Please go to the reception desk for further information.

Wilderness expedition

Survival in the wilderness? That will be great if guided by an expert. Take part in a full day-and-a-half expedition and learn how to use nature to survive in it. Learn how to make fire, catch fish, recognize edible and inedible plants, use your various tools optimally and also learn about the animals that live there. In for the challenge? Bring wet and cold weather clothing and good walking boots with you and venture forth into the Swedish wilderness. You can also do this with your family on condition that two children are accompanied by at least one adult.

Excursion for children

We have put together an attractive educational programme for children. Together with guide Lalo they can, for instance, go looking for insects that live in the vicinity of Fulufjällsbyn. After they have caught the insects in small trays, Lalo will explain the children all kinds of things about them. All children that have participated receive a certificate after the tour. Parents are asked to come along as well.

Safaris

If you are in for a unique experience, going on safari will have to be on your programme, too. Information on the various safaris mentioned below is available at the reception desk.

Elk-spotting

The elk is the symbol of Sweden – while the guide tells his stories. With a bit of luck you may encounter some in their natural habitat.

Beaver safari

Go on beaver safari along the River Fulan and take in the moving sight of these busy creatures.

Bird watching

The area is a birdwatcher's paradise. Our very experienced guide will show you the best spots for watching birds. There are, for instance, guided tours to the Rösjön lakes and to Glysjön, 20 kilometres from Särna, which is a first-rate spot for many birds in every season.

Brown bear safari

As PAN Park Fulufjället is renowned for its bear population, going on a bear safari is also possible, of course. Discover their tracks, listen to the guide's exiting stories and... with a bit of luck you will see one.
